


Fig. 1 - Forward Voltage Drop Characteristics




Fig. 2 - Typical Values of Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage




Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage




Fig. 4 - Maximum Allowable Case Temperature vs.
Average Forward Current




Fig. 5 - Forward Power Loss Characteristics




Fig. 6 - Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction to Case



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


Fig. 7 - Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs. dl_F/dt




Fig. 8 - Typical Reverse Recovery Charge vs. dl_F/dt




Fig. 9 - Typical Reverse Recovery Current vs. dI_F/dt




Fig. 10 - Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs. dl_E/dt




Fig. 11 - Typical Reverse Recovery Charge vs. dl_F/dt




Fig. 12 - Typical Reverse Recovery Current vs. dl_F/dt




Fig. 13 - Reverse Recovery Waveform and Definitions


